actions and things that are going to happen in the future



I am visiting Goldie next week.

We are going camping tomorrow.

I am laughing.



I'm laughing.

You are crying.



You're crying.

He is cooking.



He's cooking.

She is singing.



She's singing.

It is standing.



It's standing.

We are eating.



We're eating.

You are drinking.



You're drinking.

They are swimming.



They're swimming.
