PEOPLE'S NAMES

This is a card game for 2 - 4 players (or teams). Before playing the game revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity. To do this, you can use playing cards as flashcards.

Shuffle playing and wild cards. Make your own game course by placing the cards face up on the floor (or table) like this:



Students roll the dice and land on a card.

If it is a wild card, he or she follows the instruction (e.g. Miss a turn or sing an English song).

If a card has a picture and its name, they say, for example, My name is ... His / Her name is ... If a card has the text, e.g. My name is ..., kids make a corresponding question, for example, What's my name? What's your name? What's his / her name?

Each correct answer gains one point. The student with the most points wins the game.

Preparation

Print out playing and wild cards. If you want, you can stick the printout onto the heavy paper.

Cut out the individual cards, fold them and glue. You can laminate your game cards for future use.
