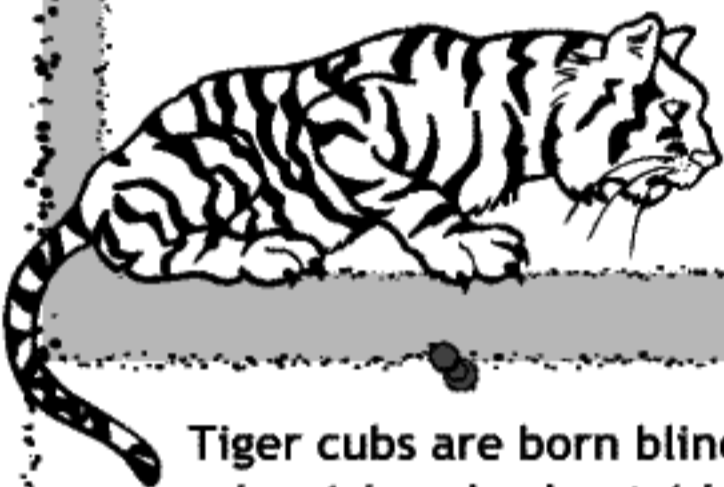


# T for Tiger
