

PRESENT CONTINUOUS MIMING

This is a game for 2 teams. Before playing the game revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity.

The aim of the game is for the kids in the teams to guess present continuous sentences from mimes.

Divide the kids into two teams.

One team goes first and chooses a team member to do the first mime.

He or she comes to the front of the class, draws a task card, asks the class *What am I doing?* and then does the mime on the card.

The other kids try to understand what he or she is doing, then answer by making a present continuous sentence, for example: *You are climbing a tree.*

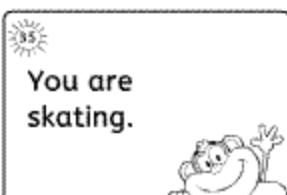
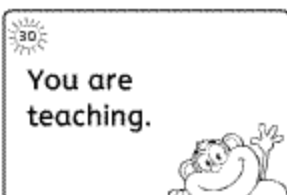
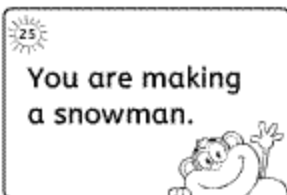
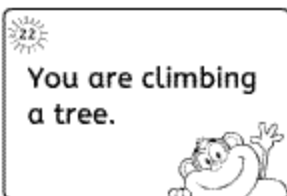
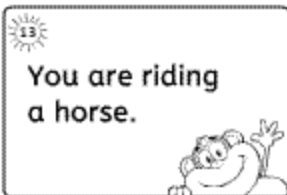
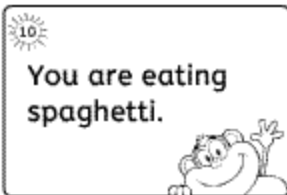
The first kid to guess the sentence scores a point for their team. Then, a player from the other team comes to the front of the class and so on.

The team with the most points at the end of the game wins.

Preparation
