We usually introduce people, animals or things using nouns first. Then we can use a pronoun instead.

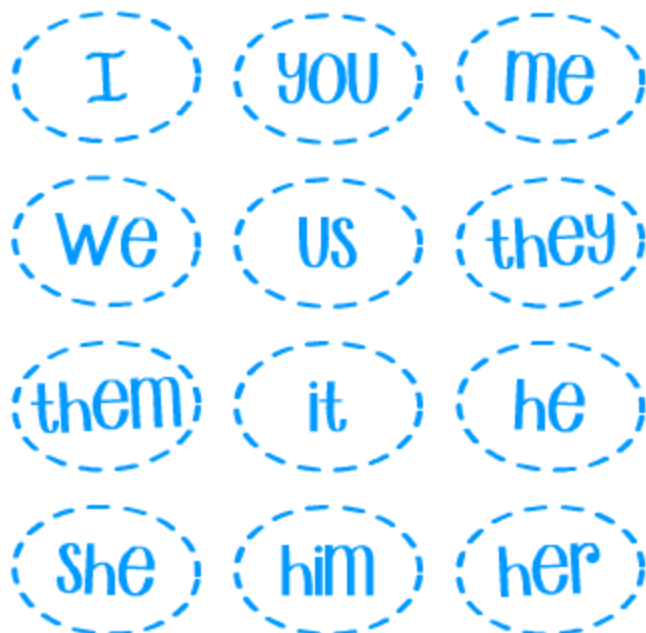
This is Daisy.
She is cute.



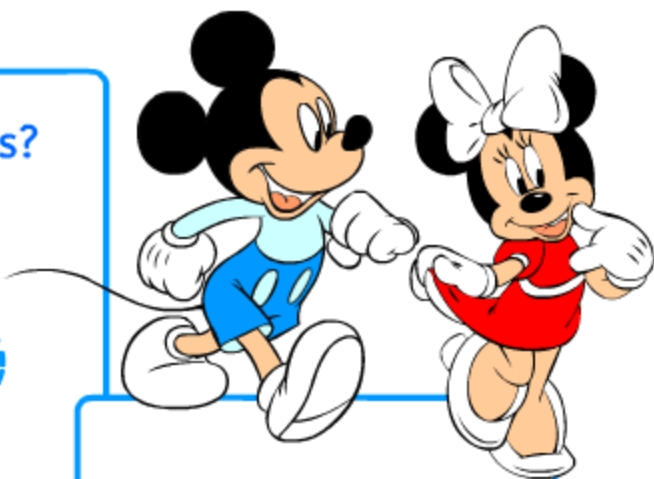
Pronouns

PERSONAL PRONOUNS. SUBJECTIVES

SINGULAR	PLURAL
     	   
one person, animal or thing	more than one person, animal or thing



Subject pronouns take the place of nouns that are the subject of the sentence.

See examples below.



Daisy is my friend.

She is my friend.

Bees make honey.

They make honey.

When we are talking about our pets, we can use **he** or **she**.

you You have dolls.	you The dolls belong to you .
he He has a rat.	him The rat belongs to him .
she She has a cat.	her The cat belongs to her .
it It has a shell.	it The shell belongs to it .
we We have a bell.	us The bell belongs to us .
you You have a box.	you The box belongs to you .
they They have socks.	them The socks belong to them .



Object pronouns take the place of nouns. They are used as the object of the verb in a sentence.



The object of a sentence is the person, place, animal or thing that receives the action shown by the verb.



Who does Fido like?

Fido likes me. ✓

Fido likes you. ✓

Fido likes him. ✓

Fido likes her. ✓

Fido likes it. ✓

Fido likes us. ✓

Fido likes them. ✓



How many pronouns can you find?

I've got a girlfriend. She is very nice and I love her very much. I've also got a guitar and I'd like to play a song on it for her right now:
