

YES, WE CAN!

This is a board game with cards for 2 - 4 players (or teams). There are 3 kinds of cards: green to practise the positive form, red to practise the negative form, and pink cards to practise making questions in English. Before the game, revise or pre-teach the vocabulary used in the activity.

Put playing cards in three piles (a green pile, a red pile, and a pink pile) face down.

Take a turn by flipping a coin (heads = move 1 space; tails = move 2 spaces).

When you land on:

a green square - pick up a card from the green pile, then use the picture and words on your card to make a positive sentence, for example, She is seven. Each correct answer gains one green point;

a red square - pick up a card from the red pile, then use the picture and words on your card to make a negative sentence, for example, She is not seventy. Each correct answer gains one red point;

a pink square - pick up a card from the pink pile, then use the picture and words on your cards to make a question, for example, Is it friendly? Each correct answer gains one pink point.

If you are right, don't move. Write down your score. At the end of the game, add them up for your total score.

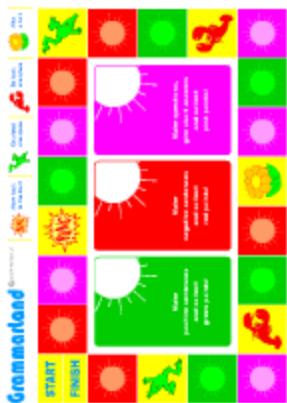
If you are wrong, move back one space.

The player with the highest score is the winner.

Preparation

Print out a game board and playing cards. If you want, you can stick the printout onto the heavy paper. Laminate for future use. Cut out the individual cards, fold them and glue.

MATERIALS



a game board



playing cards



a coin



a place marker for each player

You can use buttons or pawns as markers.
